**RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY HEALTH AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMITTEE
URGING THE NEW YORK STATE ASSEMBLY AND SENATE TO ENACT BILLS A7860-a
AND S5425-A**

WHEREAS, every person in New York State and in all the United States deserves access to affordable, quality health care; and

WHEREAS, there is a growing crisis in health care in the United State of America manifested in rising health care costs, increased premiums, out of pocket spending, decreased international business competitiveness and massive layoffs, and

WHEREAS, as of May 2009, approximately 2.6 million New Yorkers lack health insurance, and

WHEREAS, those uninsured now often experience unacceptable medical debt and sometimes life-threatening delays in obtaining health care, and

WHEREAS, the increasing expense of Medicaid and the rising costs of insuring state employees and teachers can best be met not by limiting benefits, but by eliminating the administrative waste and profiteering created by the private health insurance industry which consumes approximately 30 percent of the Unites States' health care spending, and

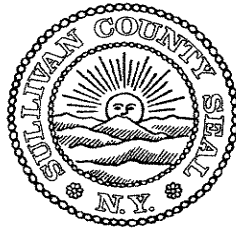
WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature appropriated funds for a state-sponsored cost benefit analysis of the various ways the state could provide health care to all its residents. The Governor's report concluded while providing universal comprehensive quality health care, a single payer system is the only plan that would reduce health spending by \$20 billion annually by 2019 below projected levels, and

WHEREAS, in adopting a state single payer plan, New York would be following the path being pursued in other states such as Vermont and California to develop universal health care alternatives to the recent federal legislation which is expected to maintain costly private insurance that does not end medical bankruptcies and denials of necessary care.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Legislature be and hereby is respectfully memorialized by the Sullivan County Legislature to enact A7860/S5425, the New York Health Bill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, Dean Skelos, NYS Senate Majority Leader, Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther and Senator John J. Bonacic.

WHEREAS, the Adult Care Center has a desire to provide diabetic shoe services to qualifying residents of the facility; and,

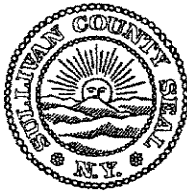

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY HEALTH & FAMILY SERVICES COMMITTEE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT AGREEMENT WITH THE NYS OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES (OCFS) TO ACCEPT GRANT MONIES FOR THE SULLIVAN COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES' HEALTHY FAMILIES OF SULLIVAN FOR THE CONTRACT PERIOD 9/1/2012 TO 8/31/2017.

WHEREAS, Sullivan County Public Health Services applied for and was awarded grant monies from the NYS Office of Children and Family Services (NYSOCFS), for the period September 1, 2012 – August 31, 2017, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution # 289-07, the County Manager was authorized to enter into a contract with the NYSOCFS to accept such grant monies, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Public Health Services Department recently has been awarded grant monies for the Healthy Families of Sullivan program for a five-year contract period (9/1/2012-8/31/2017).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Manager be and is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with NYSOCFS to accept grant monies in the amount of \$245,512 for year one (9/1/12-8/31/13) of the contract for the Healthy Families of Sullivan program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Manager is authorized to execute contract renewals for the Healthy Families of Sullivan program on an annual basis over the five year contract term, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should the NYSOCFS reduce or eliminate the grant funding for Healthy Families of Sullivan program for the grant period September 1, 2012 – August 31, 2017, then the above contracts shall be reduced and or abolished in an amount per vendor at the discretion of the County Legislature, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Manager be hereby authorized to execute such contract renewals using the NYSOCFS Contract Management System, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the form of such contract agreement (s) be approved by the Sullivan County Attorney's office.
