DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- 66 preschool special education students (ages 3-5) transitioned to Kindergarten in September 2013.
- Significant progress was made in entering all of the documentation required on sessions for Medicaid eligible services to assist with two years of back Preschool Medicaid Billing. The deadlines to submit is early October.
- The Department's grant for the Community Health Worker Program ended 9/30/13 and two staff were laid off, the third was transferred into the home care agency to help with insurance authorizations to increase revenue (RN). Maternal Infant Services Network (MISN) will be working with Hudson River HealthCare to provide a limited service to our clients who were being served by the CHW program, while the remainder of clients were referred to the Health Families program.
- The Public Health Director continued to work with Holleran Consulting, Inc. on the Community Health Assessment which is due Nov. 15. Surveys, focus groups and data analysis are almost completed. A Priority Setting session will be held Oct. 21 at CRMC. The Health Department will be working with the hospital jointly on community health improvement strategies.
