- Currently working with the college on developing short term, skill upgrade program for a cohort or learning community of long term unemployed individuals. The twenty enrolled students would complete three credit bearing courses on interpersonal communication, computers, and English composition. Employer involvement will be an important part of the program. The end result is employment. Planning for a start date in May.
- ❖ Currently working with the college on a pilot internship program. The pilot would start in the fall of 2014 and provide 3 internships, one each at the Adult care Center, The District Attorney's office and the MIS Department. Work readiness and leadership development components are being developed. The internships will be for 120 hours over the course of the semester.
- ❖ As part of the transportation policy team, interviewed on March 7 and March 10, the five respondents to the Comprehensive Transportation Plan RFP. The policy team decided to recommend awarding the contract to LSC Transportation Consultants Inc.
- ❖ The NYS Dept. of Labor has issued draft guidelines for the Program Year 2014 Regional Workforce Strategic Plan. Meetings of the HV Workforce Directors will begin next week with the plan due at the end of April. This process will update last year's plan ensuring further alignment with the goals of the HV REDC.
- ❖ The Sullivan Renaissance Youth Internship program is scheduled to begin May 14. This year 16 youth will work with Renaissance programs through the end of August, earning \$10 per hour. In addition, the youth will participate in bi-weekly leadership development sessions.
- Planning is underway to hold a seminar for employers on the facts and myths and implications of the Affordable Care Act. A Healthcare expert from the Business Council of New York will be the speaker. This seminar is tentatively scheduled for May 15.
- ❖ Met with WIC Coordinator, Amanda Langseder, on providing participants from the summer youth program to work with the creation and maintenance of a teaching garden at the Government Center. The partnership includes Public Health, Sustainable Energy, Planning Department and Sullivan Renaissance.
- ❖ Meeting with Foxwoods on April at the Liberty Community Development Corporation office to discuss their workforce education, training and recruitment needs. Also attending will be Town leaders and representatives from Liberty High School, SCCC, BOCES and the Delaware Valley Job Corps.

# <u>ACTIVITY REPORT – APRIL 2014</u> COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

March 25, 2014

In March, work continued on the Red Meat project. The Architectural Firm that was awarded the bid completed the design of the building and it is expected that in the near future a Request for Proposal will go out for the construction of the building and for components of the building. Discussions on how to get funding for the costs of the unfunded balance of the Food Hub project continued.

Collected 2014 PILOT (Payment in Lieu of Tax) funds in the amount of \$4,326,672 were dispersed to the affected taxing jurisdictions. These funds are dispersed 100% back to the jurisdictions.

The yearly IDA audit and State reporting preparations for 2014 continued, both having to be completed by March 31. This included compiling tax information and employment information and completing the Authority Budget Offices' voluminous online PARIS reporting system. Emailed required documents regarding Performance Measurement Report and Board Self Evaluation Report to State Authority Budget Office. Work on the additional paper copies to required agencies is also being completed.

Annual work to update the Agency's website is in progress.

In March, the Agency held a regular meeting and a reconvened meeting. At the reconvened meeting the Board approved its quarterly payment to the Partnership for Economic Development and it approved an extension of a sales tax exemption letter for Theowins / Catskill Brewery for their continuing construction work in Livingston Manor.

The Agency worked with several small businesses regarding IDA loan programs and the application process.

# Report to Legislature April 2014

## A. General Operations

# 1) Casino Update

- (i) With the expeditious approval of the legislature's casino subcommittee relative to the comparative analysis our third party consulting firm has begun the work. The first draft will be completed in six weeks as the Partnership will be staying in close contact to ensure deliverables are met in a timely fashion. Our instincts showing how our area was to superior to others utilizing the metrics defined by the legislation was strategically correct as other areas are now trying to declare financial hardship as a measure of need.
- (ii) We are continuing to secure local support in any fashion as it is clear that much emphasis is being put on it based on recent public statements and news stories.

# 2) Community Outreach/Marketing –

- On Wednesday March26, SCP presented, along with SC Planning and Renaissance, its programs and answered economic development questions from the Jeffersonville area business community. The event was well attended foster a workshop to be conducted in the near future there.
- SCCC/Start UP NY Outreach we have been speaking to two prospects which would be a good match for the program and provide synergies with SCCC. Ongoing.
- Internal Marketing Program 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of SCP kickoff meeting on Tuesday March 4.
- 3) Meetings with Legislators and SC Planning Ongoing effort to be more competitive in CFA process. Exploring Spring CFA forum.
- 4) Community Outreach spoke at this month's Monticello Rotary meeting relative to economic development issues. Presented at the leadership Sullivan economic development session.

### B. Project Updates

# a. Corporate Attraction

- We are meeting with a charter flight operation in mid April. It is currently located in the NY metro area and is interested in possibly located to the Sullivan County Airport to house, service and maintain its aircraft fleet.
- We are in the process of relocating a custom aluminum door and window façade manufacturing firm to Ferndale. The firm has selected a site and is exploring incentives and other issues (Costs, Taxes etc) as it performs its due diligence.

- We have been approached by a Indoor Water park Destination Resort firm interested in constructing a facility here. Not a casino project but encouraged by potential activity. TBD
- Veria International Lifestyle Management LTD. At Kutcher's construction eminent TBD.
- Ancillary projects linked to casino success are beginning to hire professional services firms and designing development plans. Most have to do with anticipated retail, workforce housing, and services demand.
- Large-scale foreign hydroponics firm interested in Hudson Valley. We spoke to them about SCCC and Start Up NY. Ongoing

### b. Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development

- SCP has facilitated the purchase and expansion of a small engine sales and services business in Liberty, NY. Apple's small engine will be purchasing Roger's small engine and adding new product lines, more employees and expanded services.
- SCP attended Brandenburg Bakery grand openingin Livingston Manor.
- IWW funds available \$175,561.09. There are currently 8 loans within this program:

### c. Business Expansion

- SCP and SCIDA and SCDPW have been working as a matter of critical importance to assist Sutphen East with several immediate needs relative to operations, workforce and potential future expansion. BOCES is pursuing dedicated training alternatives for potential employees. Sutphen has been looking to potentially relocate to as it has outgrown is current location. We will continue to work diligently to ensuring the firm remains in Sullivan County and can hopefully expand here. An incentive package is being worked on as well as possible future grant opportunities.
- Local firm looking to expand. Double in size. Putting together financing at this time.

### d. Shovel Ready Sites

- The SCP Shovel ready task force will be meeting to address the needs of existing sites
  and to analyze future demand as a result of recent developments. The goal is to
  continue to better prepare our sites for market demand and anticipated ancillary demand
  from potential resort projects.
- Effort to make existing sites more readily available to interested prospects.
- SCP met with SCCC to review and assist in the approval of its Start Up NY Plan. A key
  component is the commerce park and its business categories as we will begin proactive
  marketing once the plan is approved.

### e. Cluster Development

SCP will be formulating a specialty metal fabrication cluster. There are seven firms that
operate in Sullivan County that product specialty products in this sector. There is
opportunity for it to grow dramatically as nationwide demand for these products is high.
