Hi Annmarie,

I am writing today to ask the Sullivan County legislature to consider support of reform of New York's notorious "Scaffold Law."

Despite the name, the law doesn't necessarily have to do with scaffolds. What it does is hold property owners (including counties) 100% liable in an accident, even if they were not the primary cause. So if an employee was intoxicated or violating safety protocols, the county or contractor could still be 100% liable.

In 2012, 16 of the 30 largest lawsuit settlements in New York were Scaffold Law cases. So in the most litigious state in the most litigious country in the world, over half of our biggest lawsuits are due to one law that exists only in New York.

The law is estimated to cost \$785m public dollars every year – schools, municipalities, and public institutions like counties are paying those dollars in lawsuits and higher insurance costs.

That's why we need your help to build support outside of Albany. Please consider the attached resolution, and if any of you have any questions, please feel free to call me directly.



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Re: Supporting Necessary Reforms to New York Labor Law \$240 and \$241

WHEREAS, New York Labor Law \$240 and \$241, commonly known as the "Scaffold Law," outlines liability for injuries caused by an employee's fall from a height; and

WHEREAS, the laws impose strict liability on employers and owners of buildings if a worker falls from any height; and

WHEREAS, the law was first imposed in 1885 at a time when worker safety was largely neglected in New York State and at a time when modem safety equipment and scaffolding techniques did not exist; and

WHEREAS, the Scaffold Law has caused a dramatic increase in construction costs due to increased insurance required for employers in the construction business, causing New York State to have the highest general liability insurance costs in the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Scaffold Law is a boon to personal injury lawyers as half of the 30 largest law suits in the state stem from Scaffold Law issues and while scaffold related injuries have decreased in the past 20 years the number of Scaffold Law claims has increased 500 percent; and

WHEREAS, New York is the only state in the country to impose a construction law like the Scaffold law that imposes strict liability on the employer; further it is one of a very few laws that mandate strict liability in the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the increase in costs in New York drives away investment in our infrastructure when developers and contractors can get better rates in other states; and WHEREAS, not only does the law drive away out-of-state investment in infrastructure

but the lost investment to other states also serves to decrease the number new construction jobs created every year, making it more difficult for many of New York's skilled laborers to find appropriate employment; and

WHEREAS, recent studies by SUNY's Nelson Rockefeller Institute of Government suggests that workers are more likely to be injured due to the current version of the Scaffold Law; and

WHEREAS, this was based off statistics on construction injuries in Illinois that show a decrease in work related injuries since the 1995 repeal of its Scaffold Law at a much quicker pace than here in New York, and

WHEREAS, following the removal of the Illinois Scaffold Law, the state also found an increase in the number of construction jobs created on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, comparative negligence standards would help maintain worker safety while decreasing some of the insurance costs related to implementation of the current Scaffold Law; and

WHEREAS, this negligence standard under the Scaffold Law would not ban recovery for an injured worker due to their own negligence, but would allow the employer to bring issues with employee culpability to mitigate the damages in cases where the worker's actions contributed to his or her injury; and

WHEREAS, federal regulations have been enacted that attempt to protect workers from injury to falls by requiring certain precautions to be in place for people working at height and allows an outlet for workers concerned about their safety to engage federal review of any worksite for compliance with these regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the ____ County Legislature is strongly in support of Scaffold Law reform as well as meaningful protection of construction workers; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the _____ County Legislature supports the full repeal of the Scaffold Law or its modification to include a pure standard of comparative negligence; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, Senate Majority Leaders Dean Skelos and Jeffrey Klein and the local delegation to the New York State Legislature.

As we discussed, below please find the LaBella team's fees to complete the design phases of this project and provide the county with bid-ready plans and specifications.

These fees include a redesign effort of our design development documents that were completed back in July of 2009. This effort is being requested by Sullivan County in order reduce the overall construction costs of the project. The assumptions that LaBella is making for this approach include but may not be limited to:

- 1) Housing pods A and B are to be relocated from the noted poor soil area and moved to the south end of the jail corridor next to the other housing units.
- 2) Modify the plans to become a one-story building with two-tier housing pods.
- 3) Eliminate the Sheriff satellite office so the project becomes a 100% jail facility.
- 4) Modify the HVAC design to go with 100% commercial grade rooftop units, no mechanical attics.
- 5) The basic building to still be a 256 cell facility with double cells to 304 beds, but look for further floor plan efficiencies to reduce the overall square footage.
- 6) The core area is still designed to accommodate future expansion of up to 500 beds, but look for further floor plan efficiencies to reduce the overall square footage.
- 7) The overall square footage will be reduced from 154,000 to at least 134,000 square feet.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 373-13 dated October 17, 2013, the Sullivan County Legislature authorized the Sullivan County Community College to request funds from the State University of New York; and

WHEREAS, the State University of New York has requested language changes; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County as sponsor of Sullivan County Community College may accept funds other than county funds as its match for state capital funds; and

WHEREAS, the New York State enacted budget for community college capital programs included \$250,000 for campus equipment; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County Community College will use chargeback funds, private donations and private grants in the amount of \$250,000 for campus equipment; and

WHEREAS, NY Education Law §6310, Section 10 permits Sullivan County to apply for matching funds through SUNY for the New York State share of projects that are normally permitted within an approved capital construction budget.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby rescinds Resolution No. 373-13 and hereby adopts this resolution and authorizes the Sullivan County Community College to initiate a project and request reimbursement up to 50% of eligible project costs up to \$125,000 from the State of New York through the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York or directly from the State of New York dependant on the State appropriation backing the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no funds from the County's General Fund should be committed for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Chairman of the Sullivan County Legislature is hereby authorized to execute the necessary documents in order to convey the aforesaid premises to Robert Dadras upon payment of \$12,000.00 to the County Treasurer o/b/o the County & the Village, plus 10% of sale price for auctioneer's commission, plus fees for the County Clerk, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to satisfy the 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014 County/Town taxes, including relevied school taxes, if any, & Discharge the corresponding tax liens accordingly.
