ACTIVITY REPORT – OCTOBER 2014
COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

September 23, 2014

In September, work continued on the Red Meat project in the Village of Liberty. With the site work virtually completed, a Building Permit from the Village of Liberty was obtained and prep work for the construction of the building started. Documents were approved by the Dept of Commerce and a bid opening for the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing work occurred on September 15th, and a second bid opening for the cooler and freezer units occurred on September 26th. Work continued on drafting the request for proposals for operation of the facility, and networking with potential operators to generate interest. Staff continues to monitor all grant requirements and track the overall project budget.

With respect to other agricultural economic development programs and initiatives, IDA staff continues to attend monthly meetings of the Sullivan County Legislature's Ag Advisory Board (AAB). Staff also attends monthly meetings of the AAB's farmland protection planning subcommittee, to ensure that IDA efforts are integrated into the updated Countywide Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan. Staff is also assisting the Sullivan County Planning Division in its evaluation of a proposal to utilize USDA grant funds for the development of a local dairy processing facility.

Since the IDA held special meetings on August 27th and September 3rd, and completed its business at those meetings, the September 9th regular meeting was cancelled. At those special meetings the Board approved financial assistance for the Mohegan Sun at the Concord project and the Monticello Raceway Management/ Montreign project. The Agency also conducted a closing with both projects and agreement documents were signed.

Discussions and actions regarding the organization of a presentation to the NYS Gaming Facility Location Board for the public comment portion of their process that occurred on September 23rd also took place.

At its October 14th regular meeting the Board expects to discuss a new application from International Contracting Corporation who is looking to locate at the Sullivan County Airport Industrial Park at the existing AKL Building on Industrial Park Road. Both 2015 budgets for the IDA and the Sullivan County Funding Corporation need to be approved in October for submittal to the State by November 1. Required notifications have been dispersed, and a public hearing for the budgets will be held on October 10th.

The Agency worked with several small businesses regarding IDA and SCFC loan programs.

Report to Legislature October 2014

A. General Operations

1) Casino Update

- The Sullivan County Economic Development team was ever present and 'Sullivan United' in the final stretch of what has been a long, emotional, and challenging 14 months in this effort. The Siting Board public hearings brought many Sullivan County supporters to speak on behalf of MO², our two Concord centric projects. The day was highlighted by effectively capturing the heart of the day, with members of the Sullivan County team speaking back to back in a well prepared and coordinated presentation that we all felt impressed the Siting Board. It is important, while seemingly impossible to recognize many people that were part of the effort late last summer. Many participated in the rallies held at The Sullivan, by donating advertising, time, money and more to help ensure the passage of proposition 1 in the 1st place. Like a baseball game there are those that start the game and those that close it, but all have contributed to what will hopefully be an extraordinary win for Sullivan County.
- The Partnership and the Sullivan County Visitors Association will be hosting a meet and greet for a foreign investment group interested in opportunities in Sullivan County. There are no specifics yet as we will be vetting the group to gauge interest and possibilities.
- The Partnership, SCVA and Chamber continue to assist both Casino license applicants with special events and meetings they are coordinating. Each have target sub projects critical to their respective goals which the team will continue to assist with moving forward.

2) Internal/External Marketing and Site Development –

- The Sullivan County Partnership will be honoring over 20 Life Time Commitment supporters of the organization including of course the County at our Annual Meeting and Celebration to be held on October 9 at the Sullivan. Invitations have been sent and we look forward to a wonderful event. If you have not yet responded and intend to do so please contact Jennifer at 794-1110.
- *HVEDC* –The Partnership has re-energized our relationship with the Hudson Valley Economic Development Corporation. Critical to maximize our reach, frequency and cross networking opportunities it was necessary to maximize this relationship. We will be looking to HVEDC to host targeted events in Sullivan County, for example tying in their 3D Printing efforts to SCCC and more. Their next big event is the Hudson Valley Beer, Wine, Spirits & Cider Summit 2.0, through HVEDC's Food & Beverage Alliance. It will take place at the Culinary Institute. The keynote speaker will be *James Mariani*, CEO of *Banfi Vintners*, a leading importer in the U.S. and Featured, *Richard Ball* from NYS Ag and Markets. - 3) **Community Outreach** – I presented at the Saratoga Gaming and Racing Institute for the Albany Law School Institute of Legal Studies regarding the Impact of Commercial Casinos. The topic stemmed from the Spirit of the legislation to the impact on other gaming activities to the inclusion of Orange County effecting on the process. I will be met with the Town/Village of Liberty joint meeting in August to encourage them to seek infrastructure expansion opportunities along the Old 17 Corridor, an area zoned for Industrial/Commercial development.
- 4) **Misc** – the Partnership has just completed the elections of board members for FY 2014/2015. They have been announced. A slate of new officers will be presented and sworn in on October 9, 2014 at our annual meeting.

B. Project Updates

a. **Corporate Attraction**

- We have met with an upstate wholesale distribution company seeking 50,000 sq. ft. space to serve the metro to Albany market. An existing facility, the only one of that size that met the basic criteria, was shown. Discussions with facility owners and prospect have begun as there is genuine interest.
- We are responding to a manufacturing inquiry. A New York State firm is interested in expanding in the Hudson Valley region. The produces self lubricating carbon/graphite products for the aircraft industry. \$2.5 million investment, 10,000square feet of space and 25 jobs. Update: We are out of contention. The two critical areas that hurt our chances were, lack of infrastructure and approvals readiness. Again this speaks to the need for preapproved “Shovel Ready” sites.
- We are in discussions with a New York City chef interested in establishing a chocolate factory in Sullivan County. He has been touring several hamlets as part of his due diligence. The gentleman has ties to the area. Update: Two areas have been toured, Livingston Manor and Hurleyville. A business plan is being developed at this time based on where the prospect will ultimately choose as allocation.
- Veria Lifestyle Management is proceeding forward once again. There was a delay with the raising of certain buildings that has now been resolved. The firm has been meeting with the Town of Thompson, local contractors and professional firms as it gears up to proceed with phase 1 of its development.
- Alumitech has closed on a small building on Old Route 17 in the Town of Liberty. They produce custom Aluminum facades and doors for the NYC metro market. Update: Work has begun on the building.

b. **Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development**

- We have received an application for financing assistance an expansion project in Liberty and a Pharmacy in Callicoon. Five to ten jobs are estimated to be created as a result.
- IWW funds available \$218,968. There are currently 9 loans within this program:

c. **Business Expansion**

d. **Shovel Ready Sites**

The Partnership and SC Planning are collaborating on developing an inventory of sites suitable for future shovel ready site status. To date 70 sites have cleared the 1st selection

process. We will next be meeting with the individual towns and the real estate community to ensure we have covered all sites that could be included. A set of criteria has been used based on market demands, the expectations of sites selectors, and existing zoning. The goal is to identify and begin approvals for up to five key sites along the I-86 corridor including those that have already secured some approvals. Concurrently we will be identifying industry types that can fit within our existing zoning as a way to continue outreach efforts to small and medium sized businesses from the high cost metro area that can be encouraged to consider Sullivan County as a place to conduct their business. This two pronged approach will better position us to simultaneously address a broader window of prospective industry segments as a target. Update: The Chairman of the IDA has expressed interest in assisting with this most important effort making good use of existing professional relationships to help with developing support in Albany and with funding procurement opportunities needed to carry out this initiative. This initiative is clearly spelled out as a key deliverable in the soon to be completed Sullivan County Economic Development Plan.

e. Cluster Development

As part of our testimony to the siting location board we have made the economic, logistical and environmental case for clustering two resort destination casinos at the former Concord site. This message along with the legislative intent was well received making a compelling argument relative to locating two projects in Sullivan County.

f. Membership Education

The Sullivan County Division of Planning and the Sullivan County Partnership will have met to begin collaborating on the 2nd annual SEQRA Conference to be held in January. The event is educational in nature, where attendees can secure continuing education credits in their respective associated fields. We expect extraordinary attendance has interest is already being expressed.






Sullivan County Center for Workforce Development Summer Youth Employment Program 2014

The Center for Workforce Development's Summer Youth Employment Program is a work-based learning program. The participants do "real" work with "real" outcomes in this paid work experience.

The youth are aged 14 to 21 from Sullivan County that are experiencing their first, or perhaps second, employment position. It remains the ultimate goal of our agency to ensure a positive work experience for the youth who participate through the summer. During their experience with the Summer Youth Employment Program the youth will gain work readiness skills, positive work ethic and positive attitude.

Participants earn the federal minimum wage of \$8.00 per hour and work up to 26 hours a week. The program runs for 6 weeks during the months of July and August. This program is made possible through NY State TANF and Workforce Investment Act funding.


