ACTIVITY REPORT – MARCH 2015 COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

February 24, 2015

The IDA held its regular meeting on February 9, 2015. At that meeting the Board did an annual review of their Mission Statement, Performance Measurement Report, Disposition of Real Property Guidelines, Investment Policy, and Procurement Policy. The NYS Authorities Budget Office requires the Agency to review and approve these documents annually. These items can be found on the Agency's website. A special meeting of the IDA was held on February 26 for the Board to discuss the status of the 2015 PILOT payments that have been made by its projects.

In February, despite the inclement weather, work continued on the Red Meat project in the Village of Liberty. Approximately 85% of the building structure is complete. Work continued on drafting the request for proposals for operation of the facility, and networking with potential operators to generate interest. Equipment for the facility was purchased and is being stored until delivery to the site. Staff continues to monitor all grant requirements and track the overall project budget.

IDA staff continued working on the 2015 PILOT bills, and information needed for the FY 2014 PARIS report is being accumulated, including employment numbers. The Agency had its annual audit during the week of February 8th. Work on the audit is expected to be completed by mid-March for its submittal to the State by the end of March.

With respect to other agricultural economic development programs and initiatives, IDA staff continues to attend meetings of the Sullivan County Legislature's Ag Advisory Board. Staff also attends meetings of the Advisory Board's farmland protection planning subcommittee and also assists the Sullivan County Planning Division in its development of a local dairy processing facility.

The Agency worked with several small businesses regarding IDA and Sullivan County Funding Corp (SCFC) loan programs. In coordination with the County Planning Department and the Sullivan County Partnership for Economic Development a site visit to a potential loan recipient occurred, as did other loan work. The results of the site visits were compiled and information was submitted to the IDA's loan committee for review for possible action at its March meeting.

Report to Legislature March 2015

A. General Operations

1) Casino Update

- SCP in Partnership with CWD has been actively moving forward with the coordination of a large scale concerted workforce development and training effort to prepare for anticipated skill set requirements for direct/indirect jobs associated with the development. We have spoken to SCCC, BOCES, CCE, SCVA, SC Chamber, Empire and Adelaar, and all have conceptually agreed that bringing together the strengths of each organization under one concerted effort to prepare our workforce for the coming demand is critical. The first exploratory meeting has been tentatively scheduled for <u>March 10</u>.
- I was invited to attend a meeting called by Empire with Orange County business association executives. The purpose of the meeting was to seek interest by neighboring contractors, specifically in those who are MWBVE certified. As a requirement there are procurement goals that must be met relative to firms under this category. As construction is of primary concern right now, outreach to of course Sullivan and to neighboring counties regionally is must.

2) Internal/External Marketing -

- Stay tuned for upcoming special events providing information and opportunities for existing Sullivan County business relative to the Montreign/Adelaar developments.
- In response to our private sector effort, which has already resulted in meeting our matching requirement per our contract for services with the county the SCP Board would like to thank the legislature for its vote of confidence once again this year in approving the contract for FY2015.
 We anticipate a tremendous season when the weather breaks as the interest has already increased dramatically.
- 3) Community Outreach Renaissance, HVEDC, SC Chamber, CFA Internal project procurement workshop. We will be attending the upcoming Pattern, meet the county executives' event.

B. Project Updates

a. Corporate Attraction

We have responded to a lead for a green bio-friendly liquid battery manufacturer developed at MIT. A Start Up NY candidate the project would be consistent with SCCC's green renewable energy efforts. Update: The site selection process is now official. Dr. Karen Hilgersom and I have had communication with the firm as far back as last year in preparation for this official search. The outreach was conducted by WEDA.

- We have submitted a proposal in response to an Italian firm looking to build a food processing facility that produce high end cured hams and specialty meat products. The company is seeking to construct a 50,000 facility in the US and has visited Sullivan county sites already. TBD
- We have submitted a site proximate to SCCC for consideration of a cheese processing facility. The firm would be eligible for Start Up as it falls within the 1 mile threshold. The site has access to water and sewer which is a must. The project falls within SCCC's world nutritional arts focus. Update. The engineer working for the client has responded favorably to the location thus far.
- We have submitted out proposal and letter of interest to site selectors seeking a location for a Silicon Valley based firm that produces electronics for appliances. SCCC and Start UP NY are a good fit for this prospect. The facility would be small to mid-sized and could take advantage of the smart labs and analytics efforts the college is undertaking at this time.TBD.
- A local business man is in the process of purchasing a spark plug manufacturing business and will be relocating it to Sullivan County. The business is a 100 year old firm and currently produces for the wholesale market internationally. The new owner plans to introduce a consumer division which will create many more jobs than the five it now requires and more expansion investment as well. Update: Developing business plan and final financing.NTR
- We are in discussions with a New York City chef interested in establishing a chocolate factory in Sullivan County. He has been touring several hamlets as part of his due diligence. The gentleman has ties to the area. <u>Update</u>: Two areas have been toured, Livingston Manor and Hurleyville. A business plan is being developed at this time based on where the prospect will ultimately choose as a location. Update: The principal has scheduled a meeting with SCIDA, Planning and SCP for this week to begin moving forward with this project. Possible CFA candidate.
- We have met with an NYC producer of Healthy Fruit juices. They are looking to establish a processing facility in Sullivan County. May be a start up NY candidate. Update: Principal met with SCCC to explore mutually beneficial steps moving forward. The meeting went very well and the firm has formally applied for Start UP NY.

b. Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development

- The Partnership Revolving Loan Committee will be reviewing an application for a film production/editing startup looking to establish a facility in Sullivan County on 2/23. A location and the bulk of financing is in place. The SCIDA, Planning and SCP visited the site in Parksville and much of the base work has already been completed.
- The Partnership Revolving Loan Committee will be reviewing a loan for small beverage producer looking to expand in Sullivan County.
- IWW funds available \$99,000 There are currently 10 loans within this program:
- <u>SI</u> funds available \$ 18,000 There are currently 11 loans with this program:

c. Business Expansion

Automotive body shop will expand to a fully owned facility from existing leased space. The move will create 2-5 additional net new jobs.

d. Shovel Ready Sites

An existing owner of a key development site along the old route 17 corridor is in the process of updating engineering, addressing site plan changes, and finalizing "Shovel Ready" status on the property. As an owner of several key parcels in the Thompson/Liberty area the principal is looking to move ahead in the areas of workforce development retail and Light Industrial applications, all stemming from the Casino licensing decision. Update: Site owners have engaged new professionals to review existing work and fully complete the approvals process.

Plans for an educational forum relative to preparing for Resort Destinations in the 21st Century are beginning to formulate. A joint effort of the SCVA and SCP, it is geared at addressing a broad array if issues related to the demand expectations of a development the size and scale of Adelaar/Montreign, the added demands of Veria Lifestyle and the anticipated ancillary development, directly and indirectly associated with this development. The goal is to better prepare our existing businesses to capitalize on this opportunity and to bring awareness to challenges if any, early on. There are other similar developments sure to follow. Update: MWBVE will be a primary focus of this effort.
