SC Office of Sustainable Energy (OSE) Activities Report for April 2016

Reporting on March 2016

I. Requested information:

NYS Clean Energy Standard: The NYS Public Service Commission has produced a staff white paper regarding proposed provisions for a NYS "Clean Energy Standard." If approved by the Public Service Commission, the Clean Energy Standard (CES) will set binding targets for renewable energy that increase over time. The targets start with 27% renewables in 2017 and ramp up to 50% renewables by 2030. The Standard includes a number of specific strategies for reaching this goal. The PSC will hold a series of public hearings around the state and has invited public comment via the hearings, the PSC website, email and an opinion hotline. The comment period will close on June 6th.

The County (as well as all the towns and villages in Sullivan County) has been notified of this process and invited to comment, and the County Manager has asked the Office of Sustainable Energy to review the PSC Staff White Paper and make recommendations regarding issues the County should address in formal comments. OSE will present more details at the Agriculture and Sustainability Policy Committee meeting.

II. ENERGY MANAGEMENT FOR SC FACILITIES

- Hybrid Vehicles for SC Fleet
- Solar Installation at the Liberty Health and Community Services Campus
- Adult Care Center Energy Efficiency Measures

III. SULLIVAN COUNTY COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION (CCA)

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has issued its 76-page decision regarding the roll-out of Community Choice Aggregation projects across New York State. At present, the PSC has ruled that counties cannot serve as the aggregator of a project. The decision cited perceived complications resulting from the overlap of villages and towns within a county, and the historic existence of utility "franchises" with individual municipalities (villages, towns) as the rationale for this decision, as well as perceived complications that could arise because multiple utilities may serve a county and cross county boundaries.

SASD has begun conversations with the County Manager's office and with experts in the field to determine the most promising course of action for Sullivan County to develop a successful CCA that will achieve our goals in both cost reduction and the implementation of local renewable energy generation.

IV. CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITIES

Zoning for utility scale solar: We have received a number of requests from towns for assistance with zoning for large scale solar installations. As of this date, NY-Sun has not yet issued the model zoning ordinance they are developing for towns in collaboration with Pace University Land Use Law Center. We continue to make the following recommendations to towns:

- Consider a brief moratorium on large scale projects to provide sufficient time to develop zoning and permitting guidelines;
- Remain in the 15 year property tax exemption program and consider implementing a PILOT (payment in lieu of taxes) program for large scale projects.

V. NY PRIZE Micro-Grid Projects Liberty and Monticello

We await Booz Allen Hamilton's final draft feasibility study reports on Liberty and Monticello.

VI. Healthy Sullivan

SASD has reached out to the County Chairman to share ideas for incorporating sustainability principles across all sectors of the Healthy Sullivan Initiative.

VII. Presentations and Community Education

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY THE AGRICULTURE AND SUSTAINABLE POLICY COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A HYDROELECTRIC UTILITY REMOTE NET METERING AGREEMENT WITH GRAVITY RENEWABLES

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature continues to seek and examine various avenues for establishing savings for its operating costs; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature desires to substantially and cost-effectively reduce Sullivan County's (the "County") greenhouse gas emissions through a combination of energy conservation and the increasing use of renewable resources; and

WHEREAS, under New York State Public Service Law 66-j, opportunities exist to procure locally-generated renewable electricity through Remote Net Metering for Non-Residential Micro-Hydroelectric Customer-Generators ("Utility Remote Net Metering"); and

WHEREAS, as a cost-effective means of realizing the opportunities created by Public Service Law Section 66-j, the Tompkins County Legislature enacted Resolution 2013-117 that authorized renewable energy procurement on behalf of Tompkins County and, by the operation of New York State purchasing rules, other local governments in New York State, including Sullivan County, through its membership in the Municipal Electric and Gas Alliance of New York ("MEGA"); and

WHEREAS, following the issuance of a Request for Proposals and review of proposals, MEGA adopted a resolution awarding the renewable energy procurement for small hydroelectric facilities to Gravity Renewables, Inc. ("Gravity"), a corporation headquartered in Boulder, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, after discussions and exchanges of information with the County, on or about December 18, 2016, Gravity and the County entered into an non-binding hydroelectric Utility Remote Net Metering letter of intent which set forth the basic structure of a hydroelectric remote net metering agreement by which the County can realize both environmental benefits and utility cost stabilization; and

WHEREAS, the option agreement further refined the structure between the County and Gravity, including a 20-year term of the agreement, with an option to renew for an additional five years, the assignment of the environmental attributes of the generated energy to the County, and a mutually agreeable pricing structure; and

WHEREAS, the County will pay a refundable payment of \$2,500 to Gravity at the signing of the definitive agreement which shall be refunded in the event that Gravity cannot perform; and

WHEREAS, the County now desires to negotiate and enter into a formal hydroelectric remote net metering agreement with Gravity in conformance with the letter of intent that will result in a substantial portion of the County's demand for electricity being met by hydroelectric power generated at a facility in New York State and also result in a predictable cost of electrical energy that is projected to be less expensive than the cost associated with current energy sources;

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Manager is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute a hydroelectric remote net metering agreement between the County and Gravity Renewables, Inc., said agreement to be in such form as approved by the County Atorney.
