WHEREAS, it is desirous of a majority of the Sullivan County Legislature to amend Rule 2A to reflect a change in wording in sentence 1, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Rule 67 of the Rules of the County Legislature, said Rules may be amended upon a recommendation of the Executive Committee, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby authorizes an amendment of Rule 2A to reflect an amendment in sentence 1 as follows, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Rule 2A be amended and shall read as follows: "Annually, the enrolled members of the two political parties which have polled the largest votes in the last general election for the county", shall elect a leader of the respective parties, in caucus, prior to the first committee meeting of the year. The leader of the political party whose membership of the Legislature constitutes a majority of the Legislature shall be known as the Majority Leader. The leader of the other party shall be known as the Minority Leader. In the event that neither the members of one party nor the other constitute a majority of the members of the County legislature, then in said event, the Chairman of the County Legislature, shall designate one party leader as the Majority Leader and the other as the Minority Leader for the purpose of budgetary appropriation and other matters".

WHEREAS, the Village of Liberty took title to Premises located at West Lake St., known as 117.-1-18 for non-payment of 2008 tax liens, and subsequent years up to and including 2016 County / Town taxes and 2016 / 2017 Village taxes, and

WHEREAS, the Village has a buyer that has purchased the property for \$500.00, and

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO ESTABLISH AN OPIOID EPIDEMIC TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, Legislator Alan Sorensen began raising concerns regarding growing opioid addiction and the direct-to-doctor and direct-to-consumer marketing of pharmaceuticals in U.S. during Legislative Committee meetings in 2013; and

WHEREAS, WHEREAS, various county agencies such as the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, Sullivan County District Attorney's Office, Sullivan County Coroners, Sullivan County Public Health Services and Sullivan County Rural Health Network have noted a sustained and growing number of opioid addicted persons in our county as well as an increase in the number of deaths linked to opioid overdoses; and

WHEREAS, if not for the distribution of Naloxone to first responders, and widespread training in its use to the general public, the number of opioid related fatalities would have been significantly higher; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature, County Manager, Commissioner of the Division of Health & Family Services, and the Director of Public Health Services have identified the need for additional resources to treat those suffering from opioid addiction; and

WHEREAS, the opioid crisis affects nearly every part of Sullivan County and often starts in individuals who are prescribed opioid pain medications or who take opioid medication prescribed for other people and may progress to using illegally manufactured drugs, such as heroin; and

WHEREAS, dangerous and powerful opioids, such as fentanyl and herion, are increasingly being sold on our streets, as a substitute to prescription medications for those addicted to opioids, and no single strategy alone can address this complex, multifaceted issue; and

WHEREAS, there is coordination of several individual anti-opioid initiatives currently undertaken throughout Sullivan County, including the Sullivan County Drug Prevention Task Force which is a subcommittee of the Sullivan County Rural Health Network.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Manager hereby declares a public health crisis related to the opioid epidemic that exists in Sullivan County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Sullivan County Legislature hereby orders as follows:

1. The creation of an Opioid Epidemic Task Force ("OETF") to be headed by the Commissioner of Health & Family Services;

- 2. OETF shall include representative from the following: experts from public health agencies, social service agencies, law enforcement, physicians, mental health and addictions providers, the health insurance industry, as well as members of victims' families;
- 3. OETF shall examine all areas of the opioid crisis including, but not limited to, opioid prescribing practices, access to inpatient, outpatient, and community-based medications-assisted treatment programs, police-assisted recovery, and the distribution of lifesaving medication like Naloxone;
- 4. OETF will coordinate efforts of its members and shall have the power to create various work groups and/or other subcommittees to assist it in the performance of its duties;
- 5. OETF shall meet quarterly and report back its progress to the County Legislature on a quarterly basis until such a time as the work of the task force is no longer needed.

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF A STATE AND MUNICIPAL FACILITIES ("SAM") PROGRAM GRANT APPLICATION, OFFERING DORMITORY AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF NY ("DASNY") BOND PROCEED FUNDS, FOR A CAPITAL COST PROJECT ASSOCIATED WITH THE INSTALLATION OF DIGITAL BILLBOARD ON ROUTE 17 / INTERSTATE I-86 IN THE COUNTY OF SULLIVAN.

WHEREAS, the County Manager, has identified a need for a capital cost project for the installation of a digital billboard on Route 17 / Interstate I-86 in the County of Sullivan; and

WHEREAS, NYS Senator John Bonacic was instrumental in securing New York State funding / DASNY bond proceeds under the SAM program offering \$100,000.00 in funding for the installation of a digital billboard to be located in the County of Sullivan on Route 17 / Interstate I-86; and

WHEREAS, these funds will be available through the SAM program, under which DASNY is administering the program on the NYS Senate's behalf; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan has been assigned DASNY Project ID# 8919, and has been deemed eligible to submit the project nomination form, required documentation, and an application for SAM funding, wherein there is no matching requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Manager, Chairman of the County Legislature, and / or their authorized representative (as required by the funding source award agreement) to execute any and all necessary documents to submit the SAM application for funding; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Manager, and / or Chairman of the County Legislature (as required by the funding source) to accept the award, and enter into an award agreement or contract to administer the funding secured, in such form as the County Attorney shall approve; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should the SAM funding be terminated, the County shall not be obligated to continue any action undertaken by the use of this funding; and

RESOLUTION NO. INTRODUCED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO SET THE STAFF AUDITOR SALARY THE OFFICE OF AUDIT AND CONTROL

WHEREAS, the Staff Auditor position is a management position in the Office of Audit and Control; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature sets the salary for such a position; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Staff Auditor positon in the Office of Audit and Control shall be set at \$56,000 annually.

WHEREAS, there is a need to reclassify the Audit Clerk in the Office of Audit and Control position to a Senior Audit Clerk position to maintain the daily responsibilities of the Monticello location as well as the Liberty location.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Audit Clerk position in the Office of Audit and Control be reclassified to a Senior Audit Clerk in the Office, in accordance with the Teamsters Salary schedule.

RESOLUTION NO. OF 2017 INTRODUCED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REQUESTING THE ADOPTION OF NEW YORK STATE SENATE BILL S. 5419 AND NEW YORK STATE ASSEMBLY BILL A.7242 AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF NEW YORK STATE TAX LAW §1210(i)(33) WHICH AUTHORIZED AN INCREASE TO THE THREE PERCENT RATE AUTHORIZED BY STATE TAX LAW FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING DECEMBER 1, 2017 AND ENDING NOVEMBER 30, 2019, FOR A TOTAL SALES TAX RATE OF 8%, 4%OF WHICH WOULD BE REVENUE FOR SULLIVAN COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature has requested that the New York State Legislature adopt Home Rule Legislation that would authorize the extension of the current sales tax rate in the County of Sullivan which is presently 8%, 4% of which is revenue for Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to State Tax Law §1210(i)(33) the New York State Legislature previously authorized Home Rule Legislation that approved two increases in sales tax in the County of Sullivan; the first, by one half percent (½ %) from seven percent (7%) to seven and one half percent (7½%) and the second, an additional one half percent (½ %) from seven and one half percent (7½%) to eight percent (8%). Four percent (4%) of the eight percent (8%) is currently revenue for Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, both of the one-half of one percent increases in the sales tax are set to sunset or expire on November 30, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature desires to extend the current sales tax rate until November 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, in the event that both of the one-half of one percent increases in the sales tax rate were allowed to sunset or expire the reduction in revenues created would require the Sullivan County Legislature to increase the real property tax rate by eighteen and one half percent (18.5%) in order to make up the deficit in the 2018 budget,

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan is dealing with significant losses of revenue due to the current economic downturn and the requested extension for the increase is both necessary and in the best interest of the County and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature, by adopting Resolution No. 87-17 on January February 16, 2017, requested that the New York State Legislature adopt Home Rule Legislation extending the sunset date of New York State Tax Law §1210(i)(33) until November 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, Bill No. S. 5419 is to be presented in the New York State Senate, and Bill No. A.7242 is to be presented in the New York State Assembly; both bills being identical, would permit the extension of the current sales tax rate in the County of Sullivan which is presently 8%, 4% of which is revenue for Sullivan County, until November 30, 2019.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby requests that the New York State Senate adopt Bill No. S.5419 and the New York State Assembly adopt A.7242, which shall authorize the extension of the current sales tax rate in the County of Sullivan, to be maintained at 8% of which 4% is revenue to the County, as expeditiously as possible; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Sullivan County Legislature is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Honorable John J. Bonacic, State Senator representing the 42nd Senatorial District, the Honorable Aileen M. Gunther, Assemblywoman representing the 100th Assembly District, Hon. John Flanagan, Majority Leader of the Senate, Honorable Carl Heatsie, Speaker of the General Assembly, and the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the Great State of New York.
