WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislature has the authority under New York State Agriculture and Markets Law Section 303-b to include additional parcels in the existing certified Agricultural District No. 4 on a yearly basis; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets has consented to the Sullivan County Legislature being declared lead agency with respect to the environmental review of the proposal to add parcels to Sullivan Agricultural District No. 4; and

WHEREAS, a short form Environmental Assessment (attached hereto) has been prepared which concludes that the proposal to add parcels, pursuant to Resolutions to be adopted by the Sullivan County Legislature, to Sullivan County Agricultural Districts No. 4 will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment and conculdes that the County Legislature issue a Negative Declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby accepts the Environmental Assessment described in the SEQRA Environmental Assessment Form (attached hereto); and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby issues a Negative Declaration pursuant to the provisions of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, with respect to the proposal to add parcels to Sullivan County Agricultural District No. 4; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Sullivan County Legislature authorizes the Chairman of the Legislature to execute the Environmental Assessment Form.

Monthly Report Agriculture & Sustainability Committee Meeting – July 13, 2017

The press conference we held at Fort Delaware to help promote the County Parks went very well. I would like to thank Dan Hust for setting up the conference and all who participated and were involved. We have received a lot of terrific feedback on the event.

The Clean Team has begun work litter plucking the County roads. They have also been completing some beautification projects around the County's Cultural Center and Parks.

I looked over the existing trail system that is at the Adult Care Center and Community Complex in Liberty with staff from Public Health and Workforce for Development. We are trying to come up with a way to make a new trail system because the NYSDEC will not allow anyone on the dam that is located on the back side of the lake, which the old trail incorporated. I am currently trying to come up with a new trail system that would work around the county property.

I met with a representative from Workforce for Development in regards to finding someone to help out with daily tasks in my office.

We held the County's Trail Committee meeting at Lake Superior. We hiked around the back side of Lake Superior which proved to have great potential for a trail system throughout.

The Commemoration of the Battle of Minisink will be held this year at the Minisink Battleground Park on July 22<sup>nd</sup>. Sullivan County Historian John Conway and his wife Debra have been organizing the event.

I have been working with Debra Conway from the Delaware Company in regards to the Fallen Soldiers Monument that they are having installed at the Minisink Battleground Park. Sullivan County DPW have built a concrete base for the stone monument to sit on are going to be building a laid up stone flowerbed around the monument. We are hoping to have everything completed by the Minisink Battle Commemoration.

I had a credit card machine installed at Fort Delaware so we are now able to accept cards. I am hoping it will boost gift shop sales and admission. I will also be setting it up in the Parks and Recreation Office.

# Sullivan County Office of Sustainable Energy Monthly Report for June 2017

#### Climate Smart Communities

OSE has confirmed receiving 113 out of the required 120 points for certification as a Climate Smart
Community. Additional documentation has been submitted and we are currently anticipating 126
points. Our goal is to become certified prior to the filing of two County CFA applications as
certification is worth additional points in the scoring process. OSE continues to identify pledge
elements to further our level of certification.

#### Electric Vehicles

- The first round of applications for the County's EV Charging Infrastructure Reimbursement was due on May 25. The Town of Thompson submitted an application for a station located at the Town of Thompson Town Hall. That application was subsequently approved and the contract has been signed and returned by the Town for final execution. We anticipate more applications in the second round, due August 3<sup>rd</sup>, as the turnaround was quick for the first round from the time the program was adopted. We have several inquiries and receive more each week.
- OSE is working with Sustainable Hudson Valley's Drive Electric Hudson Valley program and EV
  Connects to gain access to low cost EV Charging stations, as well as to organize events during the
  summer season to provide information about electric vehicles as well as to offer an opportunity to
  test drive electric and plug in hybrid vehicles (Ride and Drive events).
- The Sustainability Coordinator attended a roundtable discussion at the NYSERDA offices located in Albany NY about accelerating the deployment of EV technology around the state. Representatives from State, local, and private agencies shared information about experience, best practices, existing and upcoming programs, and regulatory changes that could create opportunities for deployment of EV technology that could be beneficial to the County, its businesses and its residents.

#### Solarize Sullivan

 A mailing was coordinated between the Solarize Sullivan campaign, OSE, and the County Manager's Office. A similar mailing during the 2016 campaign generated more than 30% of the overall leads.

### Benchmarking

 OSE staff continues to compile and enter data into our benchmarking software. We are on track to have all data entered and our first reports generated by September 1, 2017 as per the County's benchmarking policy.

#### Outreach

- The Office of Sustainability has a new website, which went live on June 30, 2017.
- Staff provided the Town of Mamakating with a report and recommendations following a site visit to various Town facilities.
- Continue to field inquiries about the EV Infrastructure reimbursement program

- Tour of the OMEGA Institute's wastewater treatment plant, which utilizes an "eco-machine" to treat its wastewater onsite.
- NYSERDA EV Roundtable discussion
- Met with representative from RUPCO to discuss the Green Jobs-Green NY program
- Meeting scheduled with NYS Division of Housing and Community Renewal and Delaware Opportunities to discuss Weatherization Program

## RESEARCH PROJECTS

CCE Sullivan submitted a grant to SARE to perform research project on eggshells as a soil amendment in 2018. CCE Sullivan is also completing work on an organic no-till research project with Cornell University at a Sullivan County vegetable farm.

#### JUNE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS:

BEGINNER FARMER CLASS (Intro to Swine) June 6th

CCESC Educator Michelle Lipari will cover breed selection, breeding and farrowing, feed and nutrition, equipment, healthcare, and the regulations for selling meat.

#### **VALUE - ADDED DAIRY PROCESSING PROJECT**

The equipment for the Bethel Creamery project was delivered and installed. The new facility is currently producing yogurt. We anticipate a ribbon cutting in August and we are currently working through completing the reporting paperwork for the USDA and CDBG grant programs.

#### SC AGRICULUTRE & FARMLAND PROTECTION BOARD:

The Board officially has a logo as part of our Right to Farm educational project.

**AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT 30 DAY WINDOW:** A vote to accept the recommendation to include 2 parcels in Agriculture District #4 will take place at the August Legislative meeting and a report must by submitted by September to NYS Ag & Markets.



#### CATSKILLS KITCHEN FOOD INCUBATOR PROGRAM

The kitchen continues to gain interest and new users. Potential users have toured the kitchen and 1 new food business were recently approved to use the kitchen for their products. The Catskills Kitchen also hosted a successful cooking class. The class taught participants easy, healthy recipes that can be made using farmers market ingredients.

Upcoming programs include:

- Farmers Market Cooking Class: August 11th
- Labor Laws and Regulations: July 12th



#### Agri-Business Retention & Expansion Program:

We recently hired a new Agriculture Coordinator, through support from the County Legislature. The coordinator started on May 23rd and will start to work with farms on farm business management and business planning. In addition, the Coordinator will assist existing Ag staff on the activities below:

- Farm Assistance: Assisted 30 farms through phone, email and field visits. Assistance includes business planning, value added, hay and soil testing, best management practices and production practices
- **Programming:** Currently developing ag business programming for 2017. Programs include social media marketing, farm labor, agri-tourism, quickbooks and business planning. We recently developed a brochure highlighting all of our Ag Business programs.
- Farmer Resource Manual: We are in the process of developing a 'Guide to Farming in Sullivan County' manual. We anticipate printing and distributing the manual by July. The manual is intended for both existing and new farmers.

#### TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE:

Staff assisted producers with the following:

- Soil Testing (over 20 soil test were conducted in June)
- Pest Management: CCE staff worked with vegetable farmers to scout for potential pests
- Business Planning Support: Staff are working with new farmers and farmers looking to expand on business planning. Staff are working to develop a model Business Plan template for High Tunnels.
- Beginner Farmer: Staff have conducted field visits and meetings with landowners looking to start a farm.
- Crop production: Staff have been assisting farmers with crop production and management.

You are receiving this letter as a notification of a study that is taking place to explore the feasibility of converting the historic O&W Railroad corridor into a multiuse trail to serve the residents of Sullivan County. The plan is to complete the 50-mile stretch of the O&W Rail Trail that traverses the County from Summitville in the Town of Mamakating to Livingston Manor in the Town of Rockland, as well as an additional 10-mile O&W Spur that originally connected the Village of Monticello with the City of Port Jervis in Orange County.

To assist in this process, the Sullivan County has hired the consulting team of Alta Planning + Design. The Feasibility Study will evaluate and make recommendations on existing and incomplete segments of trail, surface type, phasing for trail development, and associated costs for the trail among other items.

One key component of the plan is public input. As adjacent property owners, we realize you most likely have questions or concerns about how this corridor is developed. It is our goal to have an open dialog about these concerns and mitigate issues as the plan is developed.

Field observations for the complete and incomplete trail segments are Planned for the 28<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> of July, 2017 (weather dependent). Two members of the consulting team will be traveling (on foot, and by bicycle) the full length of the proposed trails over this 3-day period. They will be making observations on Developed trail conditions, and undeveloped segments to evaluate existing railroad beds, road crossings, river crossings, potential trailheads and any conflicts with surrounding uses. Portions of developed trail are located on private property.
