ACTIVITY REPORT -OCTOBER 2017 COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, SULLIVAN COUNTY FUNDING CORPORATION, THE SULLIVAN COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

October 27, 2017

At its regular monthly meeting in October, the **County of Sullivan IDA** Board approved extensions of the sales tax exemption periods for two ongoing projects: BRR Brothers III, LLC and Sullivan County Fabrication, Inc., a metal fabrication facility in the Town of Fallsburg; and Adelaar Developer, LLC, a waterpark project in the Town of Thompson. The extensions will facilitate the continued construction and development of these two projects, in accordance with their agreements with the IDA. Also in October, the Board approved its regular quarterly payment to the Partnership for Economic Development in Sullivan County, Inc., and approved the IDA's 2018 IDA budget. Finally, the Board authorized the execution of a mortgage to partially finance the construction of the Yo1 Wellness Center in the Town of Thompson.

During October the IDA and Catskill Brewery completed phase one of the Brewery's expansion project, funded by a 2016 USDA-Rural Business Development Grant (RBDG). RBDG funds were used to procure various items of equipment, which will be leased from IDA to Catskill Brewery. IDA staff submitted the grant closeout report and final draw request to USDA in late October. We will now focus on two RBDGs awarded during 2017: one to facilitate phase two of Catskill Brewery's expansion, and another to facilitate the development of Goodness Grainless LLC, a bakery at the Narrowsburg Union. As in previous years, the IDA will use 2017 RBDG funds to purchase equipment that will be leased to these two businesses.

The **Sullivan County Funding Corporation** (SCFC) also met in October, to review and approve its 2018 budget.

With respect to **The Sullivan County Infrastructure Local Development Corporation** (TSCILDC), work continues on the development of infrastructure for the Adelaar project, funded by public infrastructure bonds. During October staff worked with the project developer and bond administrator to prepare a requisition for payment related to the Village of Monticello water storage improvements, in accordance with the bond documents.

IDA staff continues to work closely with the Partnership for Economic Development and the Sullivan County Division of Planning, to assist in the development of local businesses through our revolving loan programs.

In November, IDA staff will begin sending invoices to our tax abatement projects, for their 2018 payments in lieu of taxes (PILOT payments). PILOT payment due dates run from December 15, 2017 through mid-February 2018. IDA will distribute all PILOT payments to the taxing jurisdictions within thirty days of receipt.



Report to Legislature - Nov 2017

A. General Operations

- Thank you to those who attended our 23rd annual meeting. The feedback has been very positive as we were excited to see the ball room full of attendees wall to wall for the first time in many years. Our video was viewed over 14,500 times in just less than five days from the event underscoring interest in Sullivan County happenings.
- We are in the running for a 100,000 sq. ft European distillery inquiry. The firm will employ 200+ people. Principals from the company have visited Sullivan County twice with ESD representatives. The President /CEO visited the second time with interest in locating near the SUNY Sullivan in order work with the college for employee training purposes. They met with SUNY Sullivan President Jay Quaintance and were taken with the campus and the potential opportunities there. Awaiting a decision.
- A hotel group that visited the Grossinger's site this summer has informed us that they
 remain committed to moving forward with a potential project there. They are completing
 due diligence at this time.
- RFP's have been requested and received for a 6 month marketing campaign dedicated promoting training programs and a public service message to existing businesses tied to being prepared for the accelerated growth in the hospitality industry sector. An ad hoc group made up of our workforce development agencies, IDA, partnership and the county manger will oversee the execution of this effort. Update: Decision pending.

B. **Project Updates**

a. Corporate Attraction

- We met with a developer and principals representing the Grossinger's property.
 The developer is interested in former hotel properties featuring a signature golf course as well as the potential for other amenities. Update: interest remains, in due diligence phase at this time.
- We have received an inquiry for a large distillery interested in locating to New York. The facility may be as large as 100,000sq. ft with ancillary equipment included. The site consultant is seeking both existing facilities and green space options. See comments above.
- We have met with a representative of a group interested an aviation related project at the SC Airport. Deputy Depew has been very helpful with this project as he has expertise in this area. Developing.
- A manufacturer of aluminum framing products for store front facades will be locating to Sullivan County. The facility will be 10,000sq.ft and provide product to NYC clients. We have shown the Glenwild Industrial Park as well as other available locations. This would continue to add to our value added specialty metal fabrication cluster.
- We have met with a firm that constructs custom homes out of shipping containers. The firm is looking for space to streamline and simplify manufacturing component of his process. Four homes have been constructed in Sullivan County to date. A story in New York Times featuring the product has created a significant spike in demand.

b. Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development

- We have assisted both Seminary Hill Cider and Catskill Distilling with their respective ESD CFA applications. Both will be investing in facilities, equipment and jobs further enhancing our growing food and beverage industry. Catskill will be applying for marketing money for a special event initiative as well. Awaiting decision announcement.
- We have met with a firm that is interested in a shrimp raising facility. The facility will be indoors in a controlled atmospheric environment. The company is currently selling product to New York City restaurants from its current location. We have shown five locations for the 1st of three twenty five thousand sq. ft facilities that will be needed for the operation and its expansion. Developing.....

c. Business Expansion

• A local manufacturer will be investing in a new plant on a former food processing site. The plant will be producing metal racking systems for shelving, warehouse storage and other uses. The investment will bring dollars being spent outside of the US here to Sullivan County in the form of investment, jobs and a permanent ratable. We have assisted the company in a request for Empire State Development incentives. There has been substantial activity at the location thus far. Update: the project is moving forward steadily. Special thanks to Mid Hudson Region ESD offices for their assistance. Update: we will be hosting a special event marking the opening of the facility later this fall.

d. Shovel Ready Sites

 We have received all but one executed agreement for this project which is forth coming shortly. When received will be invoicing for committed funds and sending out RFQs for the project to prospective engineering firms.

Restore NY Funding Opportunity
