RIVERFEST



Riverfest celebrated its 26th Anniversary on July 23, 2017, the first big event of our fiscal year. Sponsored by Catskill Regional Medical Center,

Riverfest celebrates music, art and ecology and attracts over 2,200 people. The festival provides an audience to over 50 artists and artisans and features DVAA's annual Riverfest Poster Auction whose proceeds benefit DVAA's Visual Arts Programs.

BIG EDDY FILM FESTIVAL

Produced by DVAA, the **Big Eddy Film Festival** advances the traditional art of storytelling by showing the newest and best independent films from around the world and our own backyard. The 2017 festival screened two dozen new films (and one retrospective film) over three days, with an emphasis on the connection between audience members and the creative people behind the films we showed.

The festival hosted filmmakers from California, Pennsylvania, and New York City, who led Q&As after their film screenings. We felt this was our most successful year yet, with two sold-out screenings, seamless tech, and effective social media outreach.

GRANTS & SCHOLARSHIPS

Arts for Sullivan New York State Regrants

With funding derived from the NYS Council on the Arts, DVAA has administered "Arts for Sullivan" for 34 years. The grant program assists cultural organizations, and sometimes individual artists, to bring arts projects and cultural programs to fruition. Beyond assisting 19 groups with their cultural offerings and projects, DVAA awarded an individual artist in the community grant to **William Conway** (Mongaup Valley, NY) for the project "Runnign with the Muse",

Sullivan County Arts & Heritage Grants

Sullivan County Arts & Heritage grant program is modeled after the New York State Council on the Arts Decentralization Program and administered by Delaware Valley Arts Alliance. In FY18, thirteen organizations received funding for community concerts, a historical publication, art workshops for kids, theatrical productions, and more.

Scholarships for High School Students

Two privately funded scholarships, *The Bodenstein Scholarship for Music* and the *Stanley Segal Scholarship in the Visual Arts* are awarded to high school students following a juried process. The Bodenstein Scholarship were awarded to **Sabryna Keebler**, for her instrumental performance Mozart's "Concerto in B" and. **Kayla Gagliardo**, a visual artist, were the Segal Visual Art Scholarship recipient this year.

New York State Council on the Arts, a State Agency

DVAA's programs and operations receive funding from the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the New York State Legislature.

Sullivan County

DVAA is the Arts Council for Sullivan County and as such receives public funds from the Sullivan County Legislature for operations and re-granting through the *Sullivan County Arts & Heritage Program.*

The Delaware Valley Arts Alliance's primary programs and administrative activities are divided between locations, both in the Town of Narrowsburg, NY.

The **Elaine Giguere Arts Center**, located at 37 Main Street, was built in 1904 as the Arlington Hotel. The building is on the National Register of Historic Places. Today it hosts the DVAA's administrative offices, the Alliance and Loft Galleries, Krause Recital Hall, Signature Gifts, and two rental units which house Mildred's Lane Complex(ity) and a private business. The third and forth floors of the structure are currently used for storage. The DVAA holds a mortgage on the property.

Capital improvements in FY18 included the renovation of Signature Gifts, the installation of Split-Duct Heating/Cooling Systems in the Loft Gallery and Krasue Recital Hall, and the creation of a welcome desk in our main lobby. These projects were made possible through targetted fundraising campaigns, in-kind contributions by DVAA's board of directors and reserve funds.

DVAA's performing arts offerings and the Big Eddy Film Festival are presented at the **Tusten Theatre** which is on a cycling six-year lease arrangement from the Town of Tusten. The structure is located at 210 Bridge Street, Narrowsburg. In addition to DVAA's programs, the space is rented to arts organizations including the Delaware Valley Opera and Act Underground, for limited run productions.




