Report of retired DEC Officer Deming Lindsley. He went to Academy to provide in-service instruction. They'll be having Academy next year. Rangers have 45 coming on, DEC only has 20 coming on. Bail reform is causing problems with DEC since it affects bails and messes up system, ex. arrest for trespass; if someone is arrested 2 times, an officer can't tell anyone else, such as a coworker, Judge, etc. It's sealed in regard to violations. Even if they (arrestee) have the limit, the offense can be excused. DEC only has 15 days to get DNA, evidence, etc. DEC is being told to only give ticket and hope the offender comes in.
