Report of retired DEC Officer: Deming Lindsley He spent yesterday in Saratoga, 54 people retired people from all over the state. The association does similar stuff as Federation, hunts, fishing, education, etc.

Deming addressed updates under the law 265 regarding firearms, handguns and pistols. A person is guilty, if carrying a firearm, shotgun or rifle if he/she enters or remains on Private Property, if the owner or lessee has not permitted or have signage to enter. It's considered a restricted area and would be a felony. Persons engaging in a lawful hunting activity are exempt.
