Procedure:

Changing Straight Urinary Drainage Bag to Leg Bag

- 1. Explain the purpose and procedure for changing straight urinary drainage bag to a urinary leg bag to the patient/ caregiver. The purpose is to promote freedom in mobility while wearing an indwelling catheter.
- 2. Perform hand hygiene
- 3. Ensure patient's privacy.
- 4. Remove protective covering from tip of new urinary leg bag opening.
- 5. Clean urinary leg bag opening tip with alcohol wipe.
- 6. Wipe juncture of Foley catheter tube and urinary drainage bag tube, taking care to maintain sterility.
- 7. Place urinary leg bag tube between your fingers; keep tube's open end straight up to avoid contaminating the urinary leg bag tube.
- 8. Replace cap on straight urinary bag tube with your other hand.
- 9. Insert urinary leg bag tube into Foley catheter.
- 10. Secure straps on urinary leg bag to patient's leg, keeping urinary leg bag tube straight without kinks.
- 11. Empty, measure, observe and record urine amount in the straight urinary drainage bag.
- 12. Dispose of urine in patient's toilet.
- 13. Dispose of drainage bag in patient's trash.
- 14. Document procedure, including the following, in the patient's clinical record:
 - a. Results of changing straight urinary drainage bag to urinary leg bag.
 - b. Date and time of procedure
 - c. Any pertinent observations made during the process.

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Changing Leg Bag to Straight Drainage Bag

- 1. Explain the purpose and procedure for changing a urinary leg bag to a straight urinary drainage bag. The purpose is to promote a patent urinary flow while patient is in the recumbent position, thus preventing infections from the backflow of urine into the bladder.
- 2. Perform hand hygiene.
- 3. Ensure patient's privacy.
- 4. Remove protective covering from tip of urinary drainage tube opening.
- 5. Clean urinary drainage tube opening with alcohol wipe.
- 6. Wipe juncture of Foley catheter tube and urinary leg bag tube with alcohol wipe.
- 7. Separate junction of Foley catheter tube and urinary leg bag, taking care to maintain sterility.
- 8. Clamp catheter.
- 9. Hold Foley catheter tube with one hand; remove cap from straight urinary drainage bag and join straight drainage bag tube to Foley catheter tube.
- 10. Secure straight urinary drainage bag to side of the bed; position straight urinary drainage bag above the floor or below the level of patient's bladder.
- 11. Dispose of urine in patient's toilet.
- 12. Dispose of leg bag in patient's trash.
- 13. Document procedure, including the following, in patient's clinical record:
 - a. Results of changing urinary leg bag to straight urinary drainage bag
 - b. Date and time of procedure
 - c. Any pertinent observations made during the process.
