Procedure:

- 1. Confirm provider's order for the staple/ suture removal.
- 2. Instruct patient and/or caregiver regarding purpose for staple/ suture removal
 - a. To remove staples/ sutures
 - b. To encourage complete tissue healing
 - c. To promote skin comfort
- 3. Perform hand hygiene
- 4. Gather all necessary supplies
- 5. Explain the procedure to the patient.
- 6. Position the patient in a position of comfort that allows for the ease of staple/ suture removal.
- 7. Don disposable gloves.
- 8. Remove old dressing and discard.
- 9. Clean incision with prescribed cleaning solution.
- 10. Gently pat dry.
- 11. Removal
 - a. Staples:
 - i. Place staple remover over middle of the staple
 - ii. Squeeze the staple remover to remove the staple
 - b. Sutures:
 - i. Gently "pick up" string sutures from skin surface with forceps.

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- ii. Cute suture with sterile scissors
- iii. Pull out suture with forceps.
- 12. Assess incision line for degree of healing and any open areas.
 - a. If infection suspected, notify patient's provider immediately.
- 13. Apply dry dressing
- 14. Discard all used supplies.
- 15. Position patient for comfort.
- 16. Remove and discard gloves.
- 17. Perform hand hygiene
- 18. Document procedure, including the following, in the patient's clinical record:
 - a. Condition of incision line
 - b. Drainage, if any
 - c. Odor, if any
 - d. Patient's tolerance of procedure
 - e. Instructions provided
 - f. Any communication with the provider
