Procedure:

- 1. Confirm provider's order
- 2. Explain the purpose and procedure to the patient. The purpose is to determine bacteria type to aid provider in determining best treatment.
- 3. Gather supplies.
- 4. Perform hand hygiene.
- 5. Don non-sterile gloves
- 6. Expose the site to be cultured while maintaining the patient's privacy. The old dressing should be disposed of.
- 7. Cleans around the site with dry, sterile gauze.
- 8. Remove the cap from the culturette, exposing the sterile tipped applicator.
- 9. Beginning in the center of the wound and using a rolling motion, absorb the drainage into the sterile applicator.
- 10. Carefully insert the applicator back into the culturette while maintaining sterility of the specimen.
- 11. Crush the ampule in the tip of the culturette by squeezing.
- 12. Apply dressing to the wound according to provider order.
- 13. Label the culturette with the following:
 - a. Patient's name
 - b. Patient's date of birth
 - c. Date
 - d. Provider's name

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- 14. Complete the laboratory request form and place it with the specimen in a plastic bag for transportation to the laboratory.
- 15. Remove gloves and dispose appropriately.
- 16. Perform hand hygiene.
- 17. Document the procedure, including the following, in the patient's clinical record:
 - a. Characteristics of the wound drainage.
 - b. Patient's reaction to the procedure
 - c. The laboratory to which the specimen was delivered
 - d. Results of testing
 - e. Communication with the provider
 - f. Any other pertinent information.
