## III. WRITTEN & VERBAL REPORTS: See attached written reports

Trish Westenbroek (CCE) –

- Lydia Reidy, the Ulster County Executive Director, has taken over as the acting Executive Director for Sullivan County CCE. She is on a 6-month renewable contract and is planning to be here for a year.
- CCE is participating in a statewide monitoring program for the Western Bean Cutworm. There have not been any cutworms caught to date.
- CCE would like to partner with the SWCD for a No-Till Drill Education Program and write a co-proposal for the program. The tentative cost is approximately \$50,000. The cost would be utilized from the Millennium Funds. The District would maintain ownership of the equipment and CCE would hold the educational programs. Brian will go to Empire Farm Days to look at equipment options. Robert Kaplan made a motion to proceed with the No-Till Drill proposal, Beverly Martin seconded, the motion was passed and carried. John Gorzynski voiced concern on liability and insurance. The District will look into insurance.

## IV. <u>OLD BUSINESS</u>:

A. Neversink/Rondout Grant: See written report.

• Bids for the Ulster County Highway Garage project site were sent out. The A-1 section is a separate contingency for dewatering the site in case of heavy rain and may not be needed. Bids received for the project construction only were as follows:

Osterhoudt \$318,813.
Jorrey Excavating \$328,800.
RMS Gravel \$387,194.
Maple Ridge Enterprises \$398,970.

Robert Kaplan made a motion to award the bid to Osterhoudt, Harold Russell seconded, the motion was passed and carried.

- John Perrella, previously hired as a temporary part/time District employee, to oversee the project.
- A personnel discrepancy has come about with the Neversink/Rondout team, Meredith Maglio and Karen Rauter. Elwin Wood made a motion to move to Executive Session, Beverly Martin seconded, motion to move to Executive Session was passed and carried. Elwin Wood made a motion to come out of Executive Session, Harold Russell seconded, the motion to come out of Executive Session was passed and carried.
- The District has submitted two invoices for prepayment in the amount of \$350,000 for the Ulster County Garage project, and \$250,000 for invoice/salary payments. We are awaiting on these payments from the NYC DEP auditors. All project payments will be on hold until funding is received.

### B. Flood Mitigation Work:

- We are looking to clean up the woody debris under the bridge in Roscoe as soon as possible.
- The high water channel in Callicoon will be cleaned out, when the summer program is over.
- Working with Bob Meyer on culvert upgrades and replacements. We just completed a replacement with the Town of Delaware, where we purchased the pipe and the town did the work. These funds will eventually be paid through the Upper Delaware Flood Mitigation Grant.
- C. Chestnut Creek Grant: We are closing out the grant and most of the remaining funds are being utilized. We purchased the new engineer copier/plotter.
- D. DEC Fracking: Moved to September's Board meeting.

## V. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>:

- A. Bank Reconciliation: The June and July bank reconciliations were reviewed by the Board.
- B. Trout Program:
  - Hickling's Fish Farm will be the Supplier. Trout being offered will be Rainbow, Brook and Brown.

- Deadline for ordering will be September 16, with the distribution pick-up being held on Saturday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, between 10 and 11 am.
- The District will need to pay the supplier for the fish when delivered.

## C. District Dinner:

- **II.** MINUTES: Elwin Wood made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 8, 2011 meeting, Robert Kaplan seconded, the motion was passed and carried.
- III. WRITTEN & VERBAL REPORTS: See attached written reports

Trish Westenbroek (CCE) – See written report

- Corn days were held at the Dave Peters farm in Hortonville on September 12<sup>th</sup>.
- A strategic livestock marketing class will be held on September 15, 22, 2 and October 6<sup>th</sup> in Liberty.
- The Maple Syrup Production class will be held on September 22<sup>nd</sup> in Liberty.
- The Cornell Annual meeting will be held on October 28<sup>th</sup> at the Jeffersonville Fire House.
- CCE will hold an Ag Summit on November 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Finishing up the proposal for the millennium funds and should be done by tomorrow.
- Feed prices will remain high due to the inclement weather. There will also be a shortage of feed.
- Due to the recent tropical storms the NYS DEC has lifted the CAFO SPDES permit from August 27<sup>th</sup> to September 23<sup>rd</sup> so that farmers can spread manure.

## IV. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Neversink/Rondout Grant: See written reports.
  - The demonstration project for the Rondout has started today. John Perrella is our site supervisor for the project. The two water pumps are not handling the water. Brian suggested to ignore the pumps, do the work, and get out of the water.
  - The Claryville area was the worst hit spot from the tropical storms in Sullivan County. There was a small section through Mountaindale and Spring Glen on County Route 55. County DPW has done some work. We have looked at two sites with one more to look at for emergency flood work.
  - There were some flooding issues in the Rondout area from the storms. Brian and John met with Gary and Cathy Capella of Ulster County SWCD. They had issues above the Sullivan County line and they are working on obtaining FEMA monies or Emergency Watershed Protection monies if available. The MOU between our counties for the Neversink/Rondout grant gives them the right to fix flood related issues should they arise.
  - A letter was drafted to Mark Vian, and Beth Reichheld to take monies for the Neversink Demonstration project and use the funds for Emergency Response projects. There is about \$640,000 available for this project. The DEP is in the process of writing up a new agreement with the EPA for additional funding, which should keep the project going until December 2017, which would also replace the funds for the Neversink projects.
  - The Denning Road has five sites that they are working on. The Peekamoose Road was washed out. Town of Denning Supervisor, Bill Bruning, is concerned with getting something done around Claryville so that they have one route open going into Claryville.

## B. Flood Mitigation Work:

- Brian & John have been assessing flood damage from the storms. It is hoped that some of the flood mitigation funds can be used for these projects.
- The County is working on Falls Mills to fix the shoulder that was taken out. There was a lot of debris there in the river. A lot of secondary channels are blocked with debris and we have a contractor scheduled to remove the debris tomorrow so that the water will move away from the road.
- There is one spot across from the Town hall that runs down past the Claryville Firehouse and cuts across the road.
- The Frost Valley Road is not open yet.
- The Governor has issued a statement forgiving all permits to do emergency stream work.

#### C. District Dinner:

- There will be no awardees this year.
- Michael Angelo and Rockland House were the two restaurants that we received bids. The Rockland House has prime rib and drinks, Michael Angelo's would be a buffet and we would need to bring in a dessert. Michael Angelo's may put other diners in the room with us. The Board decided to have the dinner at the Rockland House. Lisa will call and look for a date for the end of October or the beginning of November on a Saturday.

• Brian suggested raising funds for local farmers damaged by the storms. It was suggested that there would not be enough funds raised to help many farms. Elwin Wood mentioned that there is going to be a fund raiser to help the Neversink little league park. The board suggested that would be a good idea.

## V. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>:

- A. Bank Reconciliation: The August bank reconciliation was reviewed by the Board.
- B. RC& D Invoice: After reviewing the letter from RC&D, which stated the organizations uncertain future, Elwin Wood made a motion that the District should not join the organization at the present time, Harold Russell seconded, and the motion was passed and carried.
- C. The electric bill has almost doubled over the summer months. The Board suggested looking into the bill for possible reasons. It is possible that the CCE's refrigerator is causing the increase. The utility pole by the building should also be looked at.
- D. Elwin Wood made a motion to go into Executive Session to discuss an employee. Robert Kaplan seconded, the motion to go into Executive Session was passed and carried. Elwin Wood made a motion to come out of Executive Session, Harold Russell seconded, and the motion to come out of Executive Session was passed and carried.

# IV. OLD BUSINESS:

  - The demonstration has started at the Sundown site. John Perrella remains on site to supervise the construction. The contractor should be done in approximately two weeks. There have been no problems. Neversink/Rondout staff has been coordinating with contractors for the plant materials for the live timber crib wall.
  - The refrigerated trailer that was used for the willows has been released and has been picked up by the owner.
  - A tour of the site was set for the EPA and Dept. of Health.
  - The stream buffer projects are on hold until there is more protection at the toe of the streambed.
  - There will be a small planting at the Town Hall to show what the plants look like for landowners.

- The Demonstration on the Neversink was delayed for one construction season due to floods. These funds were not able to be used for the Town on FEMA projects and flood projects. We will look at budget line items to see if there are some funds to help the town on matches.
- Outreach events planned: There was a meeting to speak to Neversink area landowners held last weekend at the Old Stone House. The Neversink Stream Management Plan has not been mailed to landowners. Aerial photographs were taken of the area. The partnership with the Tri Valley School is working out well.
- Brenden Wagner was the summer intern and the District has retained him as an employee until November to finish the plant materials and do some knotweed injections.
- Robert Hayes and the Tri-Valley FFA students took the Neversink/Rondout display to the state fair and won a Blue Ribbon. Robert Kaplan suggested that the District send a certificate to them. The EPA regulators who came want to nominate Robert Hayes for an award. Karen will be attending a Tri-Valley school board meeting in the future to give a report on all the events that have occurred.

# B. Flood Mitigation Work:

- Brian, John & Les have visited a lot of sites. It is a good time for landowners to address their flood issues while the emergency stream work permits are lifted.
- Looked at a couple culverts on Brook Road in the Town of Bethel that were washed out with the flooding. This will be a good project for the Upper Delaware grant.

### D. Electric Bill:

  - The Chestnut Creek Stream Management Plan is being updated and should be ready for distribution this winter.
  - The Watershed Advisory Group will meeting Tuesday, December 20 at 10 am at Neversink Town Hall. The Neversink Plan for town adoption will be looked at and which grant adoption model will best fit our program. It is hoped to increase admin hours to help with grant.
  - The Sundown Rondout demo project has been completed. The upstream erosion sites plantings should be completed this week.
  - The Van Aken site became a post-flood project. Progress was made in directing the channel away from the road. Will return in spring to work on a road embankment erosion treatment project.
  - Karen attended a Tri-Valley School Board meeting and gave a presentation on how the students have been helping on the projects. Possible grant programs for the school were explained to them.
  - A tour for Ulster County legislators was held last week in the Ashokan basin. We are planning on having a legislative tour here in the new year.
  - The native plants exhibit is currently at Morgan Outdoors in Livingston Manor until February. After that it will go to the Sullivan Renaissance winter event with the Tri Valley students.
  - Tote bags have been made and are being sold to raise funds for the NY State Covered Bridge
    Association to be used for the Halls Mills Covered Bridge. All profits from the sales will be
    donated on behalf of the District.
  - Brian and Karen will be holding Meredith Maglio's 6-month Performance Evaluation on Friday, December 16<sup>th</sup>. Evaluations were presented for Board review and the three Directors present, and two Directors via e-mail, have stated that Meredith's employment be terminated if she is not working out in the position. The Directors present approved extending Meredith's probation period for up to 60 days until a full quorum can be held. A letter will be given to Meredith tomorrow extending her probation period, which is before her 6-month probation period expires.

#### B. Flood Mitigation Work:
