BIG GAME REPORT 11-13-13

- 1. The NYS DEC announced that a statewide deer hunter survey is underway in an effort to provide improved deer hunting experiences across the state. All who receive the survey are encouraged to take the time to complete and return it as soon as possible. The survey is being conducted for DEC by the Human Dimensions Research Unit at Cornell University.
- 2. The DEC is planning to launch a formal study next year that officials hope will establish some hard scientific data on moose in the Adirondacks. The study will look at how many moose there actually are, how quickly the population is growing and expanding its range and how best to manage them. They currently estimate that there is 500-800 moose in NYS.

NRA REPORT 11-13-13

1. A recent hearing on the Constutionality of the NY SAFE Act has been postponed until Jan. 6, 2014. During the last court hearing the State of NY failed to "show cause" as required post August 2013 hearing. Instead they filed an "interrogatory" challenging opposition using the "Heller Decision" as their basis of challenge.

The basis for challenge is ever expanding and currently encompasses the following:

As written and currently enacted the NY SAFE Act:

Violates the 2nd, 4th and 5th, 10th and 14th Amendment protections.

Violates existing "Privacy" statues.


Violates statutory Property Rights issues.

Unfortunately the consensus is that the SAFE Acts constitutionality will ultimately go all the way to the US Supreme Court as the State has already put Plaintiffs on record advising that no matter how State Courts rule they will appeal.

Gov. Cuomo has also put all local municipalities on notice that if they expect to receive any future State Aid they'd better "get on board" and start enforcing the SAFE Act.

- 2. A major component of the NY SAFE Act gun control law is a state secret. Almost a year after the act was passed by lawmakers and signed by the governor, state officials say they aren't required to reveal how many people have registered assault weapons with the state.
- 3. The SAFE Act requires that a background check for people buying ammunition will begin on Jan. 15. But so far the state doesn't expect to have the system for administering those checks in place by this January.
